

Manor School was established on 13th March 1812, welcoming 200 boys to the school's first site, Merchant Taylors' Hall. However, in 1813 Manor School moved to King's Manor where it stayed for 109 years, until 1922.















Uniform:




- Black jumper (change) with the academy crest.
- Plain white shirt.
- Ties black with fine red stripes (change) tie should display six stripes and the knot should be an appropriate size.
- **Black trousers** should be formal, smart, plain black and suitable for a professional environment. They should be waist height and below ankle length (meeting the top of any shoes/trainers worn).
- Or a **skirt** should be plain black 'A' line skirts, with no splits or flares or extreme styles. Skirts must be knee length and not be made from tight or stretchy fabric. Plain black tights or socks should be worn with the skirt.
- Black shoes or trainers (change) plain black with no other colours.
- Black socks plain black.

Uniform supplier: Emblazon

- Students will wear uniform for the first time on their first day in September.
- Jumper and tie are the only items that need to be purchased from Emblazon.
- There are other items available at emblazon such as trousers, PE kit etc.







Skirts

- A-line
- To the knee
- Plain black (no pleating or embellishments)
- Loose material and not tight fitting











Footwear

- Plain black matt or patent formal shoes
- Plain black trainers (fully);
 no coloured branding,
 soles, tongue etc




